EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETINGS

Bobby Adams, *presiding*
Chicago Hilton—NBA President's Suite
Tues.-Wed., December 19-20, 2007

Executive Committee (EC) members in attendance: President Bobby Adams, First Vice-President Finley Hamilton, Second Vice-President Mark Heidel, Immediate Past-President and Executive Secretary/Treasurer Linda Moorhouse, and David Gregory, Past-President and Executive Committee Advisor.

Meeting called to order by President Bobby Adams at 12:40 pm on Tuesday, December 19, 2007.

Executive Secretary-Treasurer Linda Moorhouse presented the minutes and financial report. Membership has increased by 100 over last year at this time, and is 2561 at this time. There was a beginning balance of \$12,589.00 as of December 15, 2006. Revenue from that time until December 1, 2007 was \$90,828.00. Expenditures were \$72,507.00 which leaves an ending balance of \$30,910.00. Midwest 2007 expenses have yet to be taken from the budget as well as the 2007 December *NBA Journal*. In addition, the \$1,000 monthly NBA Office Administrator fee has been absorbed by LSU.

Discussion ensued on the Honorary Student membership. At this time there are 153. There are 368 student members and 30 student bridge members for a total of 555 Student Members. There is a consensus that we should increase publicity efforts.

Discussion ensued on the fees we are paying for maintenance and hosting for our website. It was determined that Executive Secretary-Treasurer Moorhouse investigate other association websites for comparison of monthly/yearly expenses.

OLD BUSINESS

AWAPA Commission Chair Robert Foster reported the 2007 AWAPA recipient is Frank Wickes. He will be honored next year at the General Membership Meeting at the 2008 Midwest Clinic. The 2006 recipient, David Whitwell, will be honored on Thursday night, December 20th at the General Membership Meeting. H. Robert Reynolds will assist with the introduction of Whitwell.

Hall of Fame Chair Bill Moody submitted a report which stated that Edward Lisk and Donald McGinnis will be inducted into the 2008 Hall of Fame on February 2, 2008 at Troy University in Troy, Alabama.

NBA/Revelli Composition Contest Chair Terry Austin reported the 2007 winner is Stephen Bryant with *Radiant Joy*. Bryant will be recognized and given his \$4,000 check at Thursday's General Membership Meeting.

NBA/Merrill Jones Composition Contest Chair Frank Wickes reported that the 2007 winner is Ryan Maine with *The Clash*. Main will be recognized and given his \$2,000 check at Thursday's General Membership Meeting.

Publications and Projects Chair Cody Birdwell reported that the next edition of the Selective Music List will be ready to post on the website by January 2008.

NEW BUSINESS

President Adams discussed having a Leadership Conference in lieu of the biennial convention which would have been held in the summer of 2008. Discussion ensued about the pros and cons of such an event. It was agreed that if the Officers and Board of Directors were to attend such an event in the summer, NBA would benefit. The first Board of Directors Meeting at the Midwest Clinic of each biennium is not very productive as it is the first time the group is together.

President Adams reported that Conn-Selmer has agreed to sponsor the \$4,000 fee for the 2007 Revelli Contest. Rich Breske of Conn-Selmer would like to assist NBA with generating more awareness of Revelli Contest, memberships, teacher motivation, Conn Selmer Summer Workshops, and online support.

First Vice-President Hamilton suggested we not limit ourselves to specific corporate partners. He would like to ensure that NBA be open to partnerships with other corporations who shared our philosophy, goals and aims. President Adams added that he does not think there is anything about Conn-Selmer that betrays our values and mission. It is important that NBA is able to get something of value from any partnership.

Past-President David Gregory reminded the committee of the positive impact that Music for All has had in sponsoring our NBA Young Composer/Young Conductor Mentor Projects.

Rich Breske and Tim Lautzenheiser of Conn-Selmer met with the Executive Committee on Wednesday morning. Breske said they are very serious about developing their education component of Conn Selmer. They want to work to keep band directors involved beyond the initial 3-4 years of initial teaching. The Conn Selmer Institute has been serving music educators for ten years. The institute focuses on more of the non-musical aspects of being a band director. Breske offered NBA 10 free Conn-Selmer Institute (CSI) scholarships. Moorhouse suggested these might go to NBA student chapter presidents. The students need to get themselves to the conference. Perhaps the NBA could help fund travel? David Gregory and Paula Crider will be on the CSI faculty this summer. Breske also offered one session to be co-sponsored by NBA. He also invited NBA to be a part of an In-service event in Memphis this spring. There are 200-250 students at CSI. Many corporations (e.g. Make Music, Wenger, Hal Leonard, GW Pepper, Manhasset) serve as sponsors of the event. Gregory suggested the EC go to the event to see how it operates, and he suggested President Adams may want to have the NBA Leadership Conference in South Bend, Indiana. Discussion ensued.

2008 NBA Community Band: David Gregory has proposed that NBA do away with the NBA Community Band. When it was started, there was no organized organization for adult bands. Since then, the Association of Concert Bands (ACB) has grown in stature and numbers. He suggested the ACB be the national sponsor of our Community Band and run it under their organization ("NBA National Community Band sponsored by ACB"). The ACB convention dates are April 2-6, 2008 in Corning, New York this year. President Adams remarked that

one problem is that the ACB conventions are held in April. This poses a problem for teachers who are still in school. Suggestions would be to maybe have ACB take over our community band for a year and see how it goes. If most of the members of the Community Band are not members of NBA, then we should not worry too much about keeping the community band. Former NBA Community Band Chair, Gerald Guilbeaux, and ACB representative Don Snowden met with the EC. The ACB does not want to jeopardize their own convention, nor do they want to compete with themselves in order to put together another ensemble on behalf of NBA. Guilbeaux also reported that the Sousa Foundation may put together a Sousa Adult Band on the off years of the NBA Community Band. Discussion ensued about keeping the event for this next summer. President Adams agreed to host the 2008 NBA Community Band in DeLand, Florida. Participants would fly into Orlando or Daytona Beach.

International Conducting Symposium: President Adams proposed we set aside \$10,000 a year for each project (ICS-Canford, England and ICS-Rome, Italy). David Gregory reported that the 2008 ICS would return to Rome, Italy. Gregory proposed he and Past-President Tom Frascillo be given \$3,000 for travel and lodging. He also believed three NBA members would also be able to travel for \$3,000 (flight and housing) for a total of \$15,000 for the project. The Italian Army Band along with a town band would be used for the event. Gregory requested that the project move forward for approval. 1st Vice-President Hamilton made a motion to approve. Second Vice-President Heidel seconded. Motion carried.

2008 CBDNA/NBA Southern Division Conference: President Adams proposed that NBA give the CBDNA/NBA Southern Division Conference more than our typical \$500 Division Grant. He would like NBA to send \$2500 since this is the only CBDNA region which partners with NBA. Immediate Past-President Moorhouse made a motion to give the conference \$2500.00. Motion carried.

Midwest Clinic Session: NBA member David McCormick suggested to the EC that NBA sponsor a session featuring our Research Grant projects. Since the Research Grants are fairly new, it was suggested that McCormick peruse all completed research grant projects in the next year to see if any are Midwest Clinic worthy. Further discussion ensued as to how to generate more NBA profile and visibility with our NBA members. One thought was to contact those selected to perform at Midwest to put something in their programs about belonging to NBA.

WASBE 2009: President Adams shared his discussions about joining WASBE for their 2009 convention. NBA could have clinics and any performances within the WASBE structure. We could also have the NBA Community Band there. Adams hopes to pursue more discussion with Rodney Winter.

Other: Discussion ensued about a possible dues increase. This past year NBA has looked to outside resources and contributions for a good portion of operating expenses. Dues have not been increased

since 1998, while postage and printing have risen. In the past the NBA Office Administrator has been paid \$1,000 a month. At this time, NBA does not pay for this expense.

Meeting called to order at 9:35 am by First Vice-President Hamilton. He asked that everyone introduce themselves.

Executive Secretary/Treasurer Linda Moorhouse presented the minutes and financial report. Membership has increased by 100 over last year at this time, and is 2561 at this time. There was a beginning balance of \$12,589.00 as of December 15, 2006. Revenue from that time until December 1, 2007 was \$90,828.00. Expenditures were \$72,507.00 which leaves an ending balance of \$30,910.00. Midwest 2007 expenses have yet to be taken from the budget as well as the 2007 December *NBA Journal*. Second Vice-President Mark Heidel thanked the Division Chairs for their work and asked everyone to refer to his written report.

President Adams asked the Board to read his column in the December 2007 *NBA Journal* before the meeting. He then went on to talk about the poor recruitment for the Honorary Student Membership. At this time there are only 153 out of 555 student members.

At-Large Representative Andrea Strauss suggested there be more in the *NBA Journal* about students—possibly a feature story in the magazine or on website such as “student teacher of the month.”

Committee Reports

NBA/Revelli Composition Contest Chair Terry Austin reported there were 50 entries this year, with one-third being international. There were 11 committee members who met and selected *Radiant Joy* by Stephen Bryant. Conn-Selmer has agreed to take over the \$4,000 sponsorship for the contest.

NBA/Merrill Jones Composition Contest Chair Frank Wickes reported that the 2007 winner is Ryan Maine with his work, *The Clash*.

Eastern Division Chair Bob Hansbrough asked the board to refer to his written report. He said a possible concern is the potential change of state chairs at the biennium change. His state chairs are all active and doing well.

Southwestern Division Chair Dustin Seifert asked the board to refer to his written report. He expressed frustration that some state chairs did not respond to his request for information. Arkansas had a change of chairs this past fall. He is not sure how to increase communication among state and division chairs.

Northwestern Division Chair Brad McDavid continues to be hampered by a low membership. He has increased statewide mailings to increase membership.

Elementary/Middle School Representative Lisa Zemlock reports that many middle school band directors offered information for the fall 2007 report. Please refer to her written report.

High School Representative Scott Taylor had no report. He offered advice that the website contain other job information related to band such as Instrument Repair, Recording Industry, etc. Specifically, jobs for those not in performance or music education.

High School Representative Diane Koutsulis talked about mentoring in the Las Vegas. She believes mentoring is all local. They have set a program in process for the local teachers. She is not sure a national program is what NBA should focus on.

At-Large Representative Andrea Strauss challenged everyone on the board to mentor at least one new teacher each year.

High School Representative David Santiago suggested that South Carolina's web site be observed for possible linking.

Military/Professional Band Representative Tim Holton talked about the marketing issues and the fact that the Southern Division of CBDNA and NBA have combined for a conference. President Adams further added the need for audiences for college bands and vice versa.

High School Representative Paula Thornton reported that she will try and make NBA more visible at the state level in Florida.

At-Large Representative Steve Gage reported that he posed three questions to himself (educational purposes). NBA has six purposes, and three are ongoing in his opinion. He wondered if there is a process for members to ask questions and disseminate information. Immediate Past-President Moorhouse responded that the current NBA website

has an interactive site for member dialog and there is also a mentor program set in place.

At-Large Representative and Journal Advertising Chair Bill Gora: In his absence First Vice-President Hamilton reported that Gora is in a new position to work to solicit ads for the *NBA Journal*. He has raised close to \$2,000 for the December 2007 *Journal*.

At-Large Representative Gage asked the Board to refer to his written report. He asked that the college student membership put the NBA Honorary Membership information on their facebook.

National Student Representative Tim Baumann reported there are 200 student members more than last year. There are also four new student chapters that have been established. Their big project is a commission for wind band, of which they have raised \$700 thus far. The project is two-fold—a new commission plus it provides publicity for NBA. Dr. Michael Kallstrom will serve as the composer. The work has been paired down to two pieces (10 minutes) for band at a cost of \$1,500. Baumann also referred the Board to his written report, and he talked about the activities his own chapter was doing.

Military/Professional Band Representative Holton asked the board to refer to his report. There are six military performances at the Midwest this year, and there is much variety in the type of the ensembles present. He encouraged members to find and access the available web links and ensembles. The Air Force is in the midst of a 60 year anniversary. A new Army initiative is the U.S. Army All-American marching band. 91 or 92 students will receive an all-expense paid trip to San Antonio to march in the All-American High School bowl game.

Research Grant and Mentor Chair Susan Creasap: In her absence Immediate-Past President Moorhouse reported on two new grant proposals which were approved by the Executive Committee. Please refer to Creasap's written reports for more information.

Music Industry Representative Steve Trull spoke on the difficulties of putting the All-American Marching Band together. Sony has agreed to contribute funds. They have been involved in marketing a video game that deals with marching band.

Music Camper Citations Chair John Darling reported he is taking over the Music Camper Citations Chair position for Joe Alme, who had 21 years of service in this position with NBA. He asked that everyone refer to his report.

Publications and Projects Chair Cody Birdwell is looking for new members to be a part of the Selective Music List committee. They should contact him if they are interested. He also would like to see more states adopt the NBA list as their own music list. He is also looking to secure corporate money to print hard copies of the list.

AWAPA Commission: First Vice-President Hamilton reported that David Whitwell, the 2006 recipient, will receive the Award at the General Membership Meeting this evening. He encouraged everyone to attend.

2008 National Community Band: President Adams reported this will meet in DeLand, Florida this summer.

2007 ICS-London: President Adams stated that the two young men who went to Canford over the summer will talk at the General Membership Meeting tonight about their experiences. The 2008 ICS event will happen next summer in Rome.

NBA Journal: President Adams asked each board member to contribute issues important to them.

Summer Leadership Conference: President Adams reported that he was planning a conference of NBA leadership in June 2008, possibly in South Bend, Indiana. This would be in partnership with Conn-Selmer and the Conn-Selmer Institute. The NBA Board of Directors will try to meet before the CSI program begins.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:30 am.

The meeting was called to order at 1:35 pm by Second Vice-President Heidel. He thanked and welcomed the members present and asked that everyone introduce themselves. He then asked everyone to read the minutes. A motion was made and seconded to accept the minutes. Motion carried.

Vice-President Heidel suggested we have copies of the State and division Chair handbook available for the Midwest Meeting next year.

Division Reports

Eastern Division Chair Bob Hansbrough referred the room to his written report. Major concerns deal with recruiting. He also expressed concern about chairs remaining in their position for the next biennium.

Southern Division Chair John Culvahouse received reports from very few chairs. He reported that at his Georgia convention, NBA has rented a restaurant/bar through corporate sponsors, and invited people to join NBA. This proved to be a good forum for networking and socializing. He also reported on the joint Southern Division conference with CBDNA/NBA at Columbus State University.

Florida State Chair Shawn Barat reported on the NBA ensembles performing at the conference.

Southwestern Division Chair Dustin Seifert discussed state chair communication difficulties in his division. He visited the state music association websites and listed the all-state concert repertoire selections for his report.

Maryland State Chair Walter Hartey talked about directors in his state not wanting to join because NBA does not service small bands.

Alabama State Chair Tim Brannon talked about bringing the top directors in his state together to talk about music at the grass roots level with the aim to identify programs in need of help.

Delaware State Chair Heidi Sarver reported there is no state convention in Delaware, only an in-service workshop. She talked about having a "band day" at her school. More bands from outside her state participated than those in her state.

Discussion ensued about the NBA membership year and why it was April 1st to March 31st. Immediate Past-President Moorhouse stated a chance in this item would have to be brought up to the Executive Committee, then the Board of Directors, and then voted on by the membership.

Wisconsin State Chair Valerie Gaffney reported that the reason NBA has so much presence in Wisconsin is that NBA members went after the good band directors to have them join NBA. The state chapter gave those band directors the chance to play at a convention. They also made sure the convention was centrally located. She suggested going person to person when recruiting and making direct contact.

Northwestern Division Chair Brad McDavid reported that no state chairs in his division were able to attend. He referred everyone to his report.

Eastern Division Chair Bob Hansbrough talked about the music teachers who are only "jobbing." These types of people may not want to be a part of an organization. He also asked if we could bring back the "NBA Reception" reminder cards to have at the NBA exhibit booth. He also suggested that the booth serve as the distribution area for state chairs. They could pick up NBA member ribbons, reception reminder card, etc.

Nebraska State Chair Carolyn Barber talked about using electronic resources for communication and resource materials.

Talk ensued about bringing in new student members with the Honorary Student Member project. Discussion also centered around the need for an NBA Press Kit.

West Virginia State Chair Ben Miller said his state was a traditional non-join band state. He has had no success in getting people join NBA.

STUDENT MEMBER MEETING Timothy Baumann, *presiding* Chicago Hilton-Lake Huron Room Thursday, December 20, 2007 11:30-12:30 pm

The meeting was called to order at 11:30 by Tim Baumann. Nine student members were present.

National Student Representative Baumann asked that all members introduced themselves and what institutions they represented. Most of the attendees were first year members of the organization. This was followed by a brief explanation as to how each member learned about the NBA. Reasons ranged from randomly finding the NBA web page to hearing about the organization from peers and professors. All participants cited service and professional development as reasons for membership.

Baumann asked members if there were any questions they had for NBA or if there was anything that could be clarified. Questions included: What type of activities do you do with your chapter? Commissioning Project Update: Baumann gave members an update of the Student Member Commissioning Project. Dr. Michael Kallstrom from Western Kentucky University has agreed to scale back the original composition to a ten minute work for \$1,500. The work will be in two parts, the first an overture for band, the second a piece for solo voice and band. Funds are currently being raised.

Conn-Selmer Institute: NBA President Bobby Adams and Executive Secretary-Treasurer Linda Moorhouse both spoke to members about the upcoming Conn-Selmer Institute. NBA has been working with CSI to ensure ten scholarships for NBA Student Members to attend the event. It was decided that the scholarships would be awarded through an application process. The institute will be held June 8th-11th on the Notre Dame University campus. Baumann will keep members updated as to application dates as they are determined.

National Student Representative Position: Moorhouse said that the National Student Representative Position would now be an elected position and that student members would choose their upcoming representative in the elections happening in the spring. Baumann will be leaving the position at the biennium change July 1st.

Baumann thanked everyone for attending the meeting and encouraged them to make the most out of their student membership.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:30 pm.

Frank Wickes, NBA/Merrill Jones Composition Contest Chair, reported the winner of the 2007 contest is Ryan Main with his work, *The Clash*. Main was recognized and spoke briefly to the membership.

Terry Austin, Revelli Composition Contest Chair, reported the winner of the 2007 contest is Stephen Bryant with his work, *Radiant Joy*. Bryant was recognized and spoke briefly to the membership.

First Vice-President Finley Hamilton and Award Chair, Doug Phillips, presented NBA Citations of Excellence to those members who were in attendance whose bands performed at the 2007 Midwest Clinic.

William Moody, Chair of the Hall of Fame Committee, reported that Edward Lisk and Donald McGinnis will be inducted into the NBA Hall of Fame of Distinguished Band Conductors in February 2008. He encouraged members to attend the event on the campus of Troy University in Alabama.

Robert Foster, Chair of the AWAPA Commission, announced that Frank Wickes had been selected the 2007 AWAPA recipient. Wickes will be presented with the AWAPA at the 2008 General Membership Meeting at the Midwest Clinic. Foster, with the help of H. Robert Reynolds, then proceeded with the 2007 AWAPA presentation to David Whitwell, the 2006 recipient. Whitwell thanked the membership and shared a few stories from his past.

President Adams reported how pleased he was with the response of the *NBA Journals*. He also encouraged members to nominate at least one person for an Honorary Student membership. He then thanked the support of the Division and State Chairs and the Board of Directors during his term of office. Before he closed, he reminded everyone of the reception following the meeting.
